We believe that the interconnectedness of people comes to life when we can talk about who we are and where we come from. Through this process people listening can find links that associate them to your family, place of birth, extended family or friends or a common interest you both share. This is more than saying your name, it's about sharing yourself.

It service also provides Whanau Ora Navigation to work with whanau and families to identify their needs and aspirations, support their participation in education, primary health and employment, and link and coordinate. Te whare tapa wha 4-week alcohol and other drug programme. This programme is based on a traditional model of Maori health as postulated by Mason Durie by looking at the whole person through a Maori kaupapa lens.
